Written declaration, under Rule 136 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure, on heart failure¹

- 1. Heart failure (HF) is a shared strategic challenge. Affecting 15 million Europeans, HF is the most frequent cause of hospitalisation in those over 65. One in five people risk developing HF in their lifetime.
- 2. Without concerted prevention, HF cases will increase by 25 % by 2030.
- 3. The risk and burden of HF can be significantly reduced through multidisciplinary care, lifestyle changes, and patient engagement and self-management. These can promote health and quality of life, and reduce costs.
- 4. HF patients often do not receive quality care according to recognised clinical guidelines, and major inequalities persist across Europe.
- 5. Few governments have adopted national plans for HF.
- 6. Both the public and health professionals have a very low awareness of HF only 3% of Europeans can correctly identify the symptoms.
- 7. The Commission is therefore called upon to consider initiatives aiming to:
 - encourage Member States to create comprehensive national plans to drive improvement and collect adequate data on HF;
 - create a Europe-wide strategy to support public awareness, patient advocacy, and exchange of research and best practice in HF;
 - support training on HF among GPs and internists, and specialisation and accreditation of training for nurses and allied health professionals.
- 8. This declaration, together with the names of the signatories, is forwarded to the Council and the Commission.
